It provides an overview of high-impact industry career opportunities in the county. We have selected opportunities that provide an annual wage of more than \$37,000, that have a level of job security and a bright long-term labor market outlook. While focused on Wyandotte County, these jobs are available throughout the Kansas City region.

Each listing gives an overview of the education needed for each career, the average regional wage for each profession and projected job growth. This guide does not attempt to cover every industry career, but highlights those we believe offer the strong opportunities in Wyandotte County. This guide is a product funded through the Wyandotte County Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) Jobs & Education Action Team led by the Wyandotte Economic Development Council in partnership with Kansas City Kansas Community College, Kansas Manufacturing Solutions, and Workforce Partnership.



The manufacturing cluster contains six career pathways: manufacturing production process development; production; maintenance, installation, and repair; logistics and inventory control; health, safety, and environmental assurance; and quality assurance. There are multiple careers in manufacturing and many of them you can achieve with a high school diploma, a certification or a 2-year degree. Some employers will even pay for your education to have a quality, high skilled employee.



Manufacturing Production Development

Product development professions involve the product lifecycle, conception to release, to bring better products to market. It is the process of product design and material selection to be modified during various manufacturing processes to create the finished product.





Production

A Production Worker is responsible for feeding raw materials into machinery, assembling goods on production lines, and monitoring the process. In addition, they carry out basic quality checks such as testing of product or packaging before shipping by adequately storing all necessary supplies.

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, this career pathway is projected to grow 5 percent by 2031 which will result in 304,000 new jobs. Glossary of Terms

Annual Job Demand - Number of jobs in demand each year on average for the industry.

Apprenticeship - An earn while you learn program that incorporates on-the-job learning with technical instruction and mentorship with long-term employment as the priority. Usually last 12 months to 4 years, depending on the employer or occupation.

Associate's Degree - A degree granted after a two-year course of study, especially by a community or junior college.

Bachelor's Degree - A degree that is given to a student by a college or university usually after four years of study.

High School Diploma or Equivalent (GED) - A Graduate Equivalency Degree (GED) is used for educational testing services designed to provide a high school equivalency credential.

Long-Term On-The-Job Training (OJT) - Training for 8 consecutive work weeks or longer that is needed for the worker to develop the skills to attain competency in the occupation

Median Annual Wage - The median wage is generally considered to be a more accurate reflection of the 'average' wage because it discounts the extremes at either end of the scale.

Moderate-Term On-The-Job Training (OJT) - Training for one month or up to 12 months that is needed for the worker to develop the skills to attain competency in the occupation

Post Secondary non-degree award – A result of completing formal postsecondary schooling. These programs lead to a certificate or other award, but not a degree.

Short-Term On-The-Job Training (OJT) - Training that is less than a full day but more than two hours that is needed for the worker to develop the skills to attain competency in the occupation
